






DATA GATHERING/REPORTING

- Off-line, QR-based rapid assessment of tree and cocoon performance in field, synchronizing with database
- Logging tree species, tree size, vigor, planting season
- GPS-lock per individual tree, for soil conditions (water retention, fertility, salinity) and slope orientation


